**ORBIT INTERNATIONAL'S POWER GROUP RECEIVES ORDERS
IN EXCESS OF \$1,000,000 FOR U.S. NAVY PROGRAMS**

Hauppauge, New York, August 15, 2007—Orbit International Corp. (NASDAQ:ORBT), an electronics manufacturer and software solution provider, today announced that its Power Group, Behlman Electronics, Inc. (“Behlman”) has received two new orders for its custom division valued in excess of \$1,000,000. Deliveries under these contracts are expected to commence in the fourth quarter of 2007 and continue through the second quarter of 2009.

Behlman received an order from the U.S. Navy for the continued manufacture of Roll Resolvers totaling approximately \$950,000. The Roll Resolvers support the Forward Looking Infrared Radar (FLIR) system used on the F/A-18 C/D aircraft. This is the fifth order Behlman has received for this critical component from the U.S. Navy since 2001 when the U.S. Navy turned to Behlman for its reverse engineering expertise on this part for the FLIR system. In addition to the Roll Resolver, Behlman provides power supply modules to the U.S. Navy in support of this system which is forecast to remain in service through 2015.

Behlman also received an order for approximately \$120,000 for a high voltage power supply used by the U.S. Navy on the UYQ-21 display console. These display consoles are used on aircraft carriers, amphibious assault ships and Aegis cruisers and destroyers. Behlman was able to solve an obsolescence problem by providing a COTS solution for the U.S. Navy's standard surface ship display system.

Dennis Sunshine, President and Chief Executive Officer of Orbit International Corp., commented, “Behlman’s expertise in reverse engineering out-of-production products is critical to the military’s ability to bridge the gap between the end of cycle life production of a system that may have seen 25 years of shipboard usage, and the start of latest state-of-the-art production consoles on a fleet wide replacement system. We remain confident that this niche market will continue to lead to additional business opportunities.”

Sunshine continued, “These new orders have increased the backlog of our Power Group to over 50% more than at this time last year. This increase, along with the increased backlog from our Electronics Group should provide our Company with a strong second half of 2007 and well position the Company for continued growth as we enter 2008.”
